## IMPORTANT—THIS AFFECTS EVERYONE

**General Data Protection Regulation.** The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) comes into force on the 25<sup>th</sup> May 2018 giving more rights to people on how their data can be used and affects all organisations that hold data on European Union Citizens. This Regulation affects every church in the UK and should be read alongside the Data Protection Bill 2017. Some of the terms used in the GDPR are:



**Data Subject:** the individual whose data the church may hold or use. This could be anyone from a full church member, to someone who has taken a course, to a couple who previously got married at the church. The church may have had visitors attend the church from years ago whose visitor cards are still in a folder, or whose information is still held on a database. Each person on whom data is held will be a Data Subject and has the right to be informed when data on them is stored or displayed; the right to access the data that is stored on them; the right to ensure the data is correct; and, the right to have the data erased from being stored or displayed.

**Data Controller:** any organisation, regardless of size, which holds or processes information about Data Subjects. For the **Church of England the PCC and the Incumbent are both Data Controllers.** This means that they are responsible for ensuring that any personal data they collect or store is handled securely, sensitively, and in a manner which reflects the lawful basis for storing the personal data. St. Faith's has names, addresses, phone numbers, email addresses and financial information such as their Giving record or Gift Aid details. GDPR requires explicit permission to be sought for the use of personal data that is held or displayed on any kind of media.

**Data Processor:** this is any third party which processes data on behalf of the Data Controller. Data Processors should provide '*sufficient guarantees*' that they will protect Data Subjects and comply with GDPR, but responsibility ultimately rests with the Data Controller and not with the Data Processor, although the two will ideally work closely together.

**Data Protection Officer:** somebody who is responsible for implementing the church **Data Privacy Policy** that has been approved by the PCC. The Data Privacy Policy is presently in draft form. At St. Faith's the Data Protection Officer is the Parish Administrator, *Pauline West*.

**Reverend David Gibbons.** This month we welcome back the *Reverend David Gibbons* who will be President and Preacher at our 9.30am Parish Communion service on Sunday 27 May—Trinity Sunday. *David* became Rector of St. Faith's in 2001 and departed to take up an appointment as Vicar of St. Mark's Episcopal Church in Barrington Hills, Illinois, USA on 27 July 2008 and is still there. *David*, his wife, *Susan*, and daughters, *Elise and Sophia*, are visiting the UK and



we are delighted to welcome them all back to St. Faith's. In their seven years at St. Faith's *David* brought in a new hymn book and also updated service books for the 9.30 Communion Service. He encouraged St Faith's to start thinking about restoring the church, and hall, through the '*Raise the Roof*' campaign and investigated whether an extension to the church was feasible to replace the hall. He and *Susan* actively supported the "*Round the Churches Bike Ride*" with all the family undertaking a sponsored bike ride. *David* will be remembered for the children's choir which he achieved by visiting schools and meeting mothers when he took his daughters to school. With the excellent support of *Susan* they started a Sunday Club, then a Godly Play and a Youth Church.

**The Bell Ringers' Teapot.** How surprising to find a teapot in a glass case on the table in the ringing chamber of St Faith's. Its history has been researched by *Alan Buswell* in 2014 and just recently by the Church Recorders. The engraving on the teapot indicates that it was given to *Mr John Staples*, a bell ringer in St Faith's from 1885 until 1896. It was presented possibly in 1877 by the Society of Amateur Bell Ringers' "*as an acknowledgement of his service instructing members, Havant 1876 and 1877*". Also engraved are the names of the '*Members of the Committee*' although it is not known which committee this is. The Pewter Society has identified the teapot as a classic Adams Style Britannia Metal teapot with features which were first introduced around 1840. The base is marked 1503, the pattern number, and the number 4 which indicates the capacity of the teapot in half pints. The Pewter Society has not seen this mark before and have requested that the pot's details should now be recorded on their data base.
