It's official....We're in 'SINC'!

Our churchyard has been designated as a 'Site of Importance for Nature Conservation' (SINC). A panel of experts from Natural England, Hampshire & Isle of Wight Wildlife Trust, Hampshire County Council and the Hampshire Biodiversity Information Centre have concluded that "the churchyard contains herb-rich semi-improved grassland of a good age in an



urban environment. The grassland diversity increases where mowing is relaxed. The churchyard is reported to have Green-winged orchid (IUCN* Vulnerable)"

THE LAST WORD: from Fr David

It is sometimes said that "a change is as good as a rest". Well, I'm about to discover if that's true!

Being an Assistant Curate (as Mthr Vickie and I both are) is a very important time of learning. Serving a curacy is, at least in part, about becoming ready to take posts of responsibility in the church—normally, going on to be in charge of a parish. That's why Curates work alongside an experienced parish priest. But one parish, even one as busy as St Faith's, can't have everything going on. So to help curates get the widest possible experience, we also spend some time on placements. In our Diocese of Portsmouth, that includes two weeks at the Cathedral—Vickie and I both have that to come some time next year. It also usually includes one month in a different parish; a chance to experience other churches and a different social context.

As many of you know, Vickie and I are rather unusual in the Church of England, because we're married to each other and we're both Curates in the same parish at the same time. That's not unique, but it's still very rare. We enjoy working together, but the time has also come when we each need to 'spread our wings' a little. To enable us to do this, I will be going on a placement to Hayling Island which will last longer than usual, where I'll be working with Revd Dr Jenny Gaffin and the people there across all three churches.

It's a very exciting opportunity for me, and I'm grateful to everybody who has helped to make it a reality—to Canon Tom and Revd Jenny, to Bishop Christopher and everybody in the diocesan staff, and of course to Mthr Vickie. But the excitement is tinged with sadness, because today (Sunday) will be my last day at St Faith's, probably until February. You'll still see me out and about in Havant, of course, but my ministerial energy and work will be concentrated elsewhere for a few months.

This isn't "goodbye"—I'm not moving house, and I'm certainly not taking a new job on Hayling—but it is quite a long "see you later". Please pray for me, for Revd Jenny, and for the parishes and people of Hayling Island; and I assure you all of my continuing prayers. Whether in Havant or Langstone, or on Hayling Island, I am sure that God has good things in store for us all.
