Win Clinnick is a regular member of the 9.30am Sunday service at St Faith's. During



the week she was a loyal member of the St Faith's church stewarding team, greeting visitors and offering them a welcoming tea or coffee. She is a member of the Walsingham Cell. She can often be found knitting most intricate patterns. Born in Newton Abbott she has had many homes in different towns and villages in England. As a young woman she worked for the then Doctor Barnardo's Homes. Every few months the workers were sent to different homes and so Win had

the experience of homes in Funtington, Milford-on-Sea and Woking. She was not happy to be sent so far away and so she came back and worked locally here around the area. She was married at Westbourne Church and lived very happily with her husband in the Gardener's Cottage on the Stansted Estate. Unfortunately her husband's health deteriorated and so he was unable to continue working at Stansted. Together with their son and two daughters they came to Leigh Park. Win was confirmed at St Alban's Church and for twenty years was an administrant there. She helped with the lunch club at the church (receiving a certificate from the Havant Volunteer Service for her commitment). She was an active member of the St Alban's Women's Club and worked at the Pastoral Centre in Havant from its opening. In 2010, she together with her friend *Edna Martin* from St Alban's Church became BBC South Community Champions. One of her most memorable experiences was in 2006 when she attended a Royal Garden Party as a result of all the service she was giving to the Community.

Hampshire and the Islands Historic Churches Trust (HIHCT) have generously given



St Faith's a grant of £1,000 towards the restoration of the Patronal banner. St Faith's together with St Nicholas is a member of the Trust which fundraises to support historic churches, chapels and churchyards. Their motto is '*Saving the Past for the Future*'. A very important event in the HIHCT's calendar is **Annual Ride and Stride**. This takes place annually on the second Saturday in September. (This year it is the 8th

September). Participants in the day who can travel by bicycle, walk, by motor bike or car or bus or even on horseback, visit churches all around the region and collect sponsorship from friends, neighbours and workmates – and others! Sponsor money raised is divided equally between the Trust and the church of the participant's choice. A small handful of St Faith's congregation has taken part in previous years. This year it is even more important that more people from our Church join in the day and support the Trust. Notices will shortly be going up in St Faith's and St Nicholas giving more details.

Notes of the Parochial Church Council Meeting held on 11 June 2018

Spiritual Development Plan The groups are still meeting to discuss '*Going Deeper*'. The Conference on 18 August for all the Parish will consider the findings of the groups and formulate a plan for future actions.

North Transept & Vestries Re-ordering Contact is still awaited from the DAC regarding a change in the proposal for the ramp. Further discussion will be taking place regarding the provision of the disabled toilet.

Plastering and Painting of the Church Painting has been restarted. Scaffolding will be delivered shortly.

Floodlighting As yet nothing further has been received from HBC regarding payment.

Hampshire and the Islands Historic Churches Trust. It was agreed that the Church should become a member of the Trust. One of the conditions for the grant which has been offered to restore St Faith's banner is for the Church to take part in the annual Round the Churches Bike Ride.

St Faith's Banner It is possible that the students at the Royal School of Needlework could work on the restoration. This could reduce the cost but the quality of workmanship would be maintained. As agreed by the PCC at the last meeting, extra funding would need to be raised.

GDPR & Privacy Policy This was accepted.

Charity Shop Volunteer Policy This was accepted with the additional phrase that it should be subjected to an annual review. The shop would now be known as '*St Faith's Charity Shop*'.

Finance Report Income is down at present for a number of reasons but the Treasurer is confident that this will be recouped by the year end. A VAT refund is due and since the Church Donation Box has been emptied regularly, it has been noticed that the takings are up. For the time being work on projects has been suspended until a balance has been restored.

Safeguarding The Statement on Safeguarding was accepted.

Health and Safety The insecurity on the church ramp in the chancel has been rectified. Concern was expressed on lone working, particularly in the Church Office. It was agreed that further discussion and consequent action was necessary.

Electoral Roll Work is ongoing on the Data Protection issues on the Roll.

Any Other Business The PCC publicly thanked *Paul Utting* for his tireless work and dedication as Church Warden and Deanery Representative over the last few years. Concern was expressed that St Nicholas, although part of the parish, has little if any mention in reports. It was agreed that the situation should be rectified. A work day was being organised to prepare St Nicholas for a wedding there in August.

It was reported that the projects on the provision of a projector and screen together with the Electronics Project had now been completed. Thanks were offered to the team who had been involved in this work.
