New Lane Cemetery: St Faith's extension

There are three volumes of Registers so the accompanying transcriptions have been compiled in three batches: 1851-1854; 1854-1895 and 1895-1936. These pages contain other information apart from burial details thanks to access permitted by the Hampshire Genealogical Society to their records of Monumental Inscriptions.

The transcriptions are arranged in register number order and the column headers are self-explanatory. Occasionally a register entry has a spelling which differs from the official civil registration record held at the General Register Office and, where this has been identified, alternate entries are made to assist with searching – one using the register information and the other the GRO data.

Since the original transcription was undertaken the sexton's record books covering the period 1844 to 1906 have been discovered in the Portsmouth History Centre archives. As a result of this a major revision has been completed and this adds some burials which were not recorded in the registers. There are also some conflicts of dates and an 'executive decision' has been taken as to which date should hold sway. Similarly the opportunity has been used to add further plot numbers which had not been annotated in the registers. Again there are some conflicts. Researchers are, therefore, as always urged to consult the original documents to make their own determination of accuracy.

Because there has been access to the HGS material, where known, dates of death have been entered and also a reference to the HGS record which provides a reference to the Monumental Inscription for the deceased. Those researchers who are interested in these details should approach HGS directly.

The original registers are archived under the care of the Portsmouth History Centre in the central library in Portsmouth. Fiche copies of these can be consulted at the Centre and a digital version is available online on the Find My Past website.
