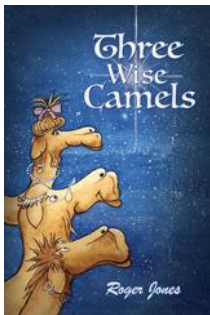

Epiphany is a Christian feast day that celebrates the revelation of God the Son as a human being in Jesus Christ. In Western Christianity, the feast commemorates principally (but not solely) the visit of the Magi to the Christ child, and thus Jesus' physical manifestation to the Gentiles. In some Western Christian denominations, especially in the past and also in the present-day Church of England, the feast of the

Epiphany also initiates a liturgical season of Epiphanytide. The traditional date for the feast is January 6. However, since 1970, the celebration is held in some countries on the Sunday after January 1. In the Church of England, the eve of the feast is celebrated as Twelfth Night. The Monday after Epiphany is known as Plough Monday.

Perhaps the most familiar Christmas carol associated with Epiphany is *"We Three Kings of Orient Are"*, written by the Reverend John Henry Hopkins, Jr., then an ordained deacon in the Episcopal Church. He was instrumental in organizing an elaborate holiday pageant (which featured this hymn) for the students of the General Theological Seminary in New York City in 1857, while serving as the seminary's music director. This hymn – to a new tune – features, together with *'Noel! Noel! Born is the King of Israel'* as the last of eight songs in Roger Jones' 2020 musical, *"Three Wise Camels"*.



Roger Jones has written a new musical, *"Three Wise Camels"* with a play by Jane Hicks. Camelia, Humphrey and Samson are three camels who set out on what proves to be the most exciting excursion of their lives! Seen through the camels' eyes, the musical reveals truths about the costly gifts of the Three Kings as they follow the extra-bright star which guides them along their way to Bethlehem where, to their amazement, they discover that the gifts are for a little boy. Samson is awe-struck when he sees angels while Humphrey wonders why the child isn't living in a palace. Camelia is just thrilled that she came! The musical ends with them all bowing

down in praise and worship of Jesus, the true King.

Those of us who enjoyed the series of musicals by Roger Jones presented monthly on Sunday evenings and *"Saints Alive!"* will be delighted with this musical, written in the first lockdown. Other Christmas musicals include *"Away in a Manger"*, *"Simeon"*, *"Stargazers"*, *"The Inn Crowd"* and *"While Shepherds Watched"*.

New PCC Member. A resident in Havant for the last twenty six years, **Sue Tinney**



has enjoyed a varied career before retirement. She originally trained as a teacher, teaching geography in upper primary and up to 'O' Level in secondary schools. Sue sponsors a boy in Senegal and has visited that country twice, an experience which she describes as '*life changing*'. She now works as an ambassador for World Vision. She gives talks about the charity to interested groups and has represented World Vision at the House of Commons and other events and exhibitions.

New PCC Member. Born in Pontypridd, South Wales, **Rex Plowman's** early claim to



fame is that *Tommy Woodward* (later known as *Tom Jones*) was at the same primary school as he was! In 1959 Rex joined the RAF as a photo interpreter. Following return to the UK he opened a fish restaurant which he ran for 30 years. He has also enjoyed many years in theatre both on stage and directing, holding an Equity card for TV and film work. His hobbies include building flying scale model aircraft, reading, playing golf and singing.
